



Rail passenger transport:

- in 2006 it was of 93 million of passengers, respectively 8.05 billion passengers-km
- Main operators: CFR Călători (state owned, 97% market share); RC-CF Trans, RegioTrans, Regional, Servtrans Investments (private ownership)

Freight Traffic:

- in 2006 52 million of tones of freight have been transported, respectively 11.57 billion tones-km
- Market structure: CFR Marfă (state owned, 74% market share to be privatised in the near future); 25 private companies, controlling 26 % market share; around 200 shunting operators

Rolling stock structure:

- 2.000 locomotives (electric and diesel)
- 218 railcars
- 60.000 freight cars
- 5.500 passenger cars..
- The average age of the locomotives 30 years
- The average age of passenger coaches 25 years





Romanian railway operators and rolling stock (4/4)







Romanian Railway System Elements that influence costs and subsequently transport tarrifs

Railway Trasports	Road Transport			
Costs to access public infrastructure				
Access charge = 3.9 EUR / train-km	Access charge = 750 EUR / truck / year			
Access charge is about 0,0089 EUR / tonne-km	Access charge is about 0,0019 EUR / tonne-km			
Railway access charge is about 21% of total revenues (where tarrifs for both systems are aprox. Equal)	Road access charges are about 1% of total revenues and they have an insigniffiant weight in transport tarrifs			
Other elements				
Taxes included in oil price (aprox 25% out of 225 Mil. EUR / year) don't return to railway infrastructure maintenance.	Part of oil taxes goes to maintenance, upgrading or expansion of road network.			
High charges for railway operators activity inspections (charges related to train-km)	There are no such charges			
It is mandatory to buy spare parts and other equipments from homologated railway suppliers (no open market)	The spare parts market is completely liberalized
